The amphibian aircraft are normally based and operated from Beverly Airport, Beverly, Massachusetts, a Naval Auxiliary Air Facility of Naval Air Station, Squantum, Massachusetts.

In addition to its routine patrols this Squadron completed seventeen escort missions and four special missions. All flights were cancelled because of weather conditions on 5 days: June 19, 20, 21, 24, and 25.

Blimp Squadron ELEVEN operates from NAS South Weymouth, under Commander Task Group 02.1.3 (Commander Northern Air Group), Commander Task Group 02.1 (Commander Northern Group) and Commander Task Force 02 (Commander Eastern Sea Frontier). This BlimpRon has no subordinate units, but operates ZNP K-type airships assigned to it by Commander Fleet Airships, ATLANTIC.

Armament and equipment, so far, has varied with the different blimps. In general, they carry two free .30 cal. machine guns, one fore, and one aft, four 325 pounds depth charges set for 50 feet, MAD equipment, Radio (2 transmitters), and Radar. Fuel load usually carried is 600 gallons, the exact volume varrying between 500 and 700 gallons, according to the estimated duration of each patrol. Blimps are able to operate for as long as 48 hours if necessary. (For full details on these blimps, see Chapter IV, page 5, "History of Group One Operations" which was included as Annex A (No. 7) of the December '42 War Diary.)

Poor flying conditions made it necessary to cancel all operations on 5 days: June 19, 20, 21, 24, and 25.

The blimps made a total of 95 flights. They were as follows:
